

SITUATION

- The consequences of the extreme rainfalls generated by the "El Niño" phenomenon and the passage of cyclone "Yaku" remain severe. According to preliminary estimates by the National Institute of Civil Defense (INDECI) as of April 18, the emergency has generated 351,824 people affected and affected. Likewise, the National Humanitarian Network has estimated an approximate of 119,300 homes impacted, of which 19,800 have been destroyed or are in uninhabitable condition. OCHA estimates 517,000 people affected as of April 13.

HUMANITARIAN COUNTRY TEAM

- In the last week, at the national level, IOM has participated in six meetings with different humanitarian actors in Lima, Lambayeque, Piura and Tumbes.
- In Piura, it has participated in the coordination meetings convened by OCHA to monitor progress in the provision of responses. IOM highlighted the information collected on camp management, which will be useful for the provision of assistance.
- In Tumbes, meetings have been held with UNHCR, UNICEF, OCHA, UNDAC and WFP by humanitarian agencies, and with representatives of civil defense, army, education, social inclusion, and the regional government, to present an update on the situation and promote the correct filling of the EDAN files. From these meetings emerged the commitment of the United Nations Disaster Assessment and Coordination - UNDAC to carry out field visits with authorities to identify needs. In addition, IOM has organized the provision of weekly assistance to the affected population.

- In Lambayeque, it has been coordinating with the Roundtable for the Fight against Poverty to review the instruments that will be used for the collection of information in camps, including those of the National Institute of Civil Defense (INDECI).
- In Lima, it has participated in meetings with the Ministry of Health, who have committed to establish four emergency brigades to attend to people affected by the mudslides of Carabaylo, Puente Piedra, Ancón and Comas. In addition, it has participated in the Protection meeting of the National Humanitarian Network, in which the planning that IOM will implement in DTM and camp information management was presented.

CAMP COORDINATION AND CAMP MANAGEMENT (CCCM)

- IOM leads the CCCM sector in emergency response. With the aim of improving the quality of information available, identifying needs and facilitating the provision of humanitarian assistance, IOM continues to collect and systematize information on camps established at the national level. As of April 18, 72 active and 1 planned camps have been identified, in addition to 19 closed or relocated camps.

ACCTIONS DEVELOPMENT

To date, IOM has carried out 56 activities of coordination and management of camps, protection, food security and nutrition, WASH and coordination within the framework of the emergency; providing assistance to 5,566 people, considering 59% of refugees and migrants (RyM) residents and 1% in transit; as well as 40% of host community (CA), in the regions of La Libertad, Lima, Piura, and Tumbes.
